Understaffing can only lead to inefficiencies, loss of potential revenues and safety concerns, and as such, the APWU's position is that this duty assignment should be reposted. There are many possibilities where this duty assignment would work in the best interest of the U.S. Postal Service, and best serve our patrons who have come to expect and deserve quality service. The reposting of this duty assignment would be a positive step in the right direction towards providing our customers with the quality service that they have come to expect and deserve.

As you are aware, the Bulk Mail Unit suffers at times due to improper staffing levels. The re-posting of this position would not only relieve potential problem, but reposting it with a few minor tweaks here and there, would be most beneficial. Reverting this duty assignment is simply a step in the wrong direction, especially in these crucial times where the USPS is striving to keep our service at a high level while attempting to keep our customer base solid.
