Re: DBCS Safety Concerns

Mark:

As you know, we have been witnessing many grievances on the one-person staffing, and the USPS has been paying out a lot of monies over the past few years to the employees. Working one-person per machine is causing injuries to our employees, and this is a very serious Safety problem. There are many documents and handbooks addressing this as a Safety concern. Please forward this letter to the Orlando P&DC's Safety Committee. The USPS has been paying monetary remedies, but the real issue is that it is causing injuries, both long and short term to our employees, and it is simply unacceptable.

The USPS continues to deliberately expose employees to ergonomic risks and health concerns due to not abiding to the MOU, titled <u>APWU #HQTG20160085-DBCS Staffing</u>, with regards to operating the DBCS machines with a minimum of two operators per machine. In 2011 a study was performed by OSHA whereas the manufacturer recommends that there be a rotation every 30 minutes, as well as two people per machine.

Since the USPS seems to be placing Safety as one of their top priorities, I am perplexed as to why this one-person per DBCS machine is continuing daily? Please forward this letter to the Orlando P&DC's Safety Committee. I am also forwarding this letter to the Suncoast District's Safety Manager.
